- Consider authorizing Fire Chief Shane Suthers to purchase the mini pumper through the FY2023 Assistance Firefighters Grant. A motion was made by Vice-Mayor Jarnigan. The motion was seconded by Alderman Sandidge. A roll call vote was obtained and was unanimous in favor of approving.
- Consider the Surgoinsville Community Kitchen, held at 1034 Main Street, to be a Town hosted event that Alderman Mierek will continue organizing. A motion was made by Alderman Bishop. The motion was seconded by Alderman Hoss. A roll call vote was obtained and was unanimous in favor of approving.
- Consider accepting the 2024-2025 Property Conservation Matching Grant Program through Public Entity Partners. A motion was made by Alderman Bishop. The motion was seconded by Alderman Collier. A roll call vote was obtained and was unanimous in favor of approving.
- O Consider authorizing payment for County \$222 & City \$88 property taxes at 113 Hendricks Street that were accumulated prior to the Town's ownership. A motion was made by Vice-Mayor Jarnigan. The motion was seconded by Alderman Hoss. A roll call vote was obtained and was unanimous in favor of approving.
- O Consider the appropriate budget amendment for 110-41110-320 to purchase 7 new chairs for the Legislative Board to utilize during meetings. A motion was made by Vice-Mayor Jarnigan to purchase chair Option #1 in the amount of \$149.99 each. The motion was seconded by Alderman Collier. A roll call vote was obtained and was unanimous in favor of approving.
- Consider approving the 2025 Holiday Schedule. The voting was unanimous in favor to approve the 2025 Holiday Schedule as written.
- Consider transitioning medical, vision, & dental coverage providers to BlueCross BlueShield through Partners for Health with the State of TN with an effective date of January 1st, 2025. A motion was made by Vice-Mayor Jarnigan to proceed with Option #2. The motion was seconded by Alderman Bishop. A roll call vote was obtained and was unanimous in favor approving.
- O Consider Resolution 157-2024 which is a resolution to adopt the terms and conditions for the extension of the existing sewer trunk line along Main Street to Lee Highway (US 11-W) through proximity to the Virginia Hills Subdivision. A motion was made by Alderman Collier. The motion was seconded by Alderman Bishop. A roll call vote was obtained and was unanimous in favor of approving.
- O Acknowledged that the 2011 Ford F350 has been declared a total loss due to storm damages on 09/27/2024. After the \$500 deductible, the settlement is \$23,500.

- O Alderman Collier made a motion that Megan Gentry & Police Chief Hammonds work outside of normal business hours to review all sewer user files to ensure that the necessary documents are included. The motion was seconded by Alderman Sandidge. The voting was unanimous in favor to approve the minutes as written.
- O Alderman Bishop requested an update from Mayor Graham regarding the conversation with the employees that have CDLs requirements that have not been met. Mayor Graham stated that Lee plans to retire in less than a year and that he is not interested in obtaining his CDLs. The Board requested that a document be created to include the details of Lee's retirement along with Lee's signature. No additional updates were provided.
